FOOD FOR THE HUNGRY... AND LONELY

"It's that time of year when hours at work are cut back," she told me when I asked how things were going while greeting her at the Crossroads Ministry front desk on a chilly morning this week. The Estes Valley's seasonal economy means many hardworking persons simply can't make ends meet without a little help during the wintertime. She hadn't been in to see us since the first part of this year, and seemed almost apologetic about needing to return for help with groceries. We assured her that's why we are here and shared how we are glad for the privilege of easing her burden.

Whether it is underemployed persons like this appreciative client, the temporarily unemployed, or households subsisting on a low fixed-income due to disability or advanced age, about one out of every 12 persons in the Estes Valley rely on Crossroads Ministry every year.

Our services will extend further starting in January 2018 when we add permanently or temporarily homebound persons to the list of neighbors who will have access to nourishing food and compassion, thanks to Crossroads Ministry's commitment to running Estes Valley Meals on Wheels. We expect to serve 27 to 40 households per day. (See related article, p. 3)

MEALS ON WHEELS STAFFING

As we continue preparations for a smooth transition of the Meals on Wheels program, two recent developments have resulted in an opportunity to better staff for even more effective services.

First, Beth Headley, who coordinates the existing Meals on Wheels service for the Town of Estes Park, accepted an unanticipated opportunity to fill a position with the Estes Valley Recreation and Parks District. While we were excited about Beth's original plans to serve with us at Crossroads, the hours and responsibilities with EVRPD are an ideal fit for Beth, and we are appreciative of how diligently she is working with us to make sure that the transitions already in process will continue to unfold seamlessly.

Second, in the past several months, plans had already been developing to consider restoring a much-needed part-time pantry coordinator position at Crossroads, a role that was eliminated when job descriptions were restructured in late 2015.

It appears possible to combine this proposed part-time pantry coordinator position with the half-time Meals on Wheels Coordinator position that was already planned, allowing us to secure one highly-qualified full-time staff person as the newest addition to the Crossroads Ministry team. Look for an announcement about our newest ministry team member later this month, as arrangements are finalized.

HOW IT HAPPENS...

Crossroads has such a powerful impact in our community thanks to vital partnerships (see, for example, "Through the Fire..." on p. 3), the support of sponsoring churches, and especially the generosity of many caring individuals, families, and groups. Two fun ways to help are coming up soon: a benefit concert for Crossroads is set for Saturday, Oct. 28, at Presbyterian Community Church of the Rockies (see p. 2); and our largest fundraiser of the year, Vintage 2017, is Sunday, Oct. 29, at the Dunraven Inn (see p. 4). Through the Fire...

Even when your worldly possessions are few, losing them all is devastating.

The call came in Friday afternoon, September 8. Captain Corey Pass of the Estes Park Police Department, who also chairs the Board of the Estes Park Extension Salvation Army, explained that a fire was in progress at a local apartment building, and asked that we mobilize the resources of the Red Cross, Salvation Army, and Crossroads Ministry.

At first the extent of damage was uncertain, but things gradually became clearer as I joined local Red Cross representative Bill Howell at the scene, after I was asked to interpret on behalf of the displaced residents. One unit – housing a total of five adults from two separate families – was destroyed, while a nearby unit was smoke-damaged but habitable.

After a brief on-site visit, Bill and I met with the families in the Crossroads Board Room, to coordinate assistance for our distressed neighbors. By 5:00 p.m., the organizations had arranged lodging for four nights in two rooms at a local hotel. Crossroads also issued vouchers for clothing and household items from the Village Thrift Shop and Elizabeth Guild, and for gasoline, thanks in part to funding available through Crossroads' partnership with the Salvation Army. Additionally, the Red Cross was able to provide immediate assistance valued at several hundred dollars per person to help each of the adults with pressing needs.

At a follow-up meeting in our Board Room that next Tuesday, Crossroads and the Red Cross provided additional assistance and confirmed that the families had been able to secure longer-term housing. We also worked to get a much-needed air purifier for the residents of the adjoining unit.

Possessions were destroyed, but hope and compassion prevailed, thanks to the commitment of local churches, the generosity of many faithful supporters, and the labors of volunteers and staff, along with vital and effective partnerships.

Estes Valley Meals on Wheels Banquet

Good Samaritan Estes Park Village along with Morrison Community Living recently hosted a fundraising banquet to help Estes Valley Meals on Wheels acquire necessary equipment for safe food preparation and storage. The event raised more than \$11,000. Nearly 40 guests enjoyed an elegant five-course meal prepared and served by Chef Max Humbrecht.

“The amount of enthusiasm generated from the community is apparent from the fact that \$6,400 was received from ticket sales while proceeds totaled \$12,400,” said Tim McLemore, Executive Director of Crossroads. “The

equipment purchased with the help of these funds will help Estes Valley Meals on Wheels get off to a strong start when Crossroads begins coordinating the program starting January 2018.”

The event’s success was due in large measure to low expenses and the generosity of a number of sponsors, including Snowy Peaks Winery, Estes Park Medical Center, OtterCares Foundation, Estes Park News, Enchanted Florist, and Estes Park Trail-Gazette.

Additional generous donations were made by Good Samaritan Society Estes Park Village and Morrison Community Living.

Total cost for the needed equipment will be between \$15,600 and \$26,600, depending on the quality of the equipment that can be purchased. Thanks to an additional generous grant from the Estes Valley Community Fund, Community Foundation of Northern Colorado, sufficient funds are now secured to ensure purchase of the equipment!
