


Crossroads Ministry

A Christian service agency helping Estes Valley residents in need, including the temporarily unemployed who receive short-term assistance, and the working poor or persons with low fixed incomes who receive ongoing services. Crossroads Ministry partners with numerous other agencies to maximize benefits to clients, and encourages self-sufficiency through educational opportunities.

Services Include

-  Food services, twice monthly or more frequently in emergency circumstances, to alleviate or prevent hunger. Special food distribution for holidays.
-  Temporary housing assistance to prevent rental eviction or mortgage foreclosure for non-payment; and temporary emergency lodging.
-  Meals on Wheels supplies a well-balanced nutritious meal to people who are unable to prepare meals for themselves.
-  Utility assistance to prevent or reverse shut-off of utilities due to non-payment, including electricity, gas, propane, other fuels; assistance in completing the application to the LEAP program.
-  Assistance with costs of medical, dental, prescriptions, and mental health services.
-  Limited transportation assistance, including costs of gasoline for essential and emergency travel.
-  Vouchers for clothing, household goods, laundry and shower services.
-  Compassionate personalized case management and referrals to a wide range of community agencies and services for additional resources and assistance.
