Key Community Partners

As the only "storefront" with a physical location and full-time staff to assist people in their time of need, Crossroads is making a collective impact by expanding their partnership network with specialized organizations and businesses. With the increased collaborations there is continuous communication, mutually reinforcing activities, and shared resources to meet needs quickly and help people reach a level of self-sufficiency to the best of their ability.

Our most vital partners include: THE SALVATION ARMY. In 2022,

Crossroads administered \$16,482 to help persons in need on behalf of this extraordinary organization. In addition to purchasing the food that comes from the Food Bank For Larimer County, they provide funds for

emergency lodging, utility assistance and support a portion of the Meals on Wheels program.

YMCA OF THE ROCKIES. We started slowly picking up food again and repackaging it for our neighbors. We anticipate a busy summer with more food donations to pass on to our clients.

SAFEWAY, ESTES PARK. This remarkable corporate citizen is a major provider of food for the clients served by Crossroads Ministry. In 2022, Safeway donated a remarkable 23,430 pounds, with the help of Crossroads volunteers who pick up food from Safeway and deliver it to Crossroads 365 days per year. Two other businesses who donate on a daily and weekly basis are Starbucks (761 pounds) and Country Market (12,491 pounds).

FOOD BANK FOR LARIMER COUNTY. More than 90% of the assistance Crossroads provided to Estes Valley residents in 2022 was connected with food. In addition to local businesses, the Food Bank for Larimer County is a major source of food.

DUNRAVEN INN. Each year, the "Rome of the Rockies" donates their facility and an abundance of exquisite food for a "Vintage" event fundraiser. In 2022 we were in a larger space with upwards of 190 people in attendance that generated over \$170,000 in charitable giving. We are grateful for the visionary leadership of Andy Morgan for hosting this event for us.




